In the UK, we're home to the UK's youth-led menstrual movement - working with young people to break down stigma, transform school culture, and influence national policy. We're looking for a passionate, independent, and skilled individual to come on board and support us to deliver some really exciting new work across the UK.

About the Role

This is a flexible freelance role (approx. 1 day per week) that will put you at the heart of our UK work. You will be:

- Supporting teachers, students, and local councils across the UK to deliver an in-school pilot of a brand-new primary school menstrual health curriculum, alongside our youth-led Toilet Policy Toolkit helping schools implement the government's Free Period Product Scheme effectively and transform school culture to advance menstrual justice.
- Providing hands-on support to the <u>Empower Period Committee</u>, our dynamic youth board made up of 13 young menstrual justice activists from across the UK - helping them design and lead campaigns and events, access funding and amplify youth action.

You'll represent Irise in schools and communities, build strong partnerships, and make sure young people's voices are heard at every level.

Who We're Looking For

- Confident in developing resources and delivering online and in-person training, adapting materials to meet the needs of diverse audiences and ideally within a formal school setting
- Strong understanding of the **UK education system** and ideally demonstrable experience working with teachers and learners
- An experienced **trainer, facilitator and relationship-builder** who can engage confidently with people of all ages in schools and councils.

- Skilled in **co-designing and conducting evaluations with young people**, including surveys, focus groups, and interviews, and able to analyse data to produce clear, impactful reports.
- A strong **communicator** with a passion for social justice and youth empowerment.
- Highly **independent and organised**, able to manage your own time and deliver projects on the ground.
- Flexible and willing to travel regularly across the UK (expenses covered).

Desirable: experience in education, youth work, or advocacy; knowledge of menstrual justice or gender equality issues; access to your own vehicle and full UK driving licence.
